□ In January 2020 the school went in to a National Lockdown due to the Pandemic. This lockdown started on 4<sup>th</sup> January and did not officially finish until March 8<sup>th</sup> 2021. The school was open for children of key workers and vulnerable pupils. During the Period of time there is no official records on pupil attendance, The only records on attendance kept were for safeguarding purposes.

On 18th Mar 2020 the school went in to lockdown following Government guidelines due to a national pandemic. The school did not reopen for all pupils until September 2020. Although 2 year groups were invited into school from June 20, parents had the option to keep pupils at home and continue with home
