Enquiry Questions:

1. When was Chichester established?
2. How has Chichester changed?
3. Why were the walls built in Chichester?
4. What was life like living inside a walled city?
5. How does trade reflect Chichester's traditions?

CONTEXT:

Children will learn about the city they live in and attend school. They will develop and understanding of what life was like and how it has changed as well as giving them an insight in to Roman life which they will cover again in Year 4.

- There are four Roman plaques in Chichester at every entrance of the walls.
