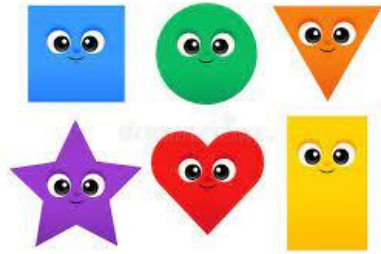
PRIOR KNOWLEDGE:

Year 4 Autumn 2 Les formes Shapes



Lesson Focus:

- L1** - . To introduce the aim of the unit 'Les formes'. In this lesson, pupils will learn how to name (with accurate pronunciation) and remember the first five (of a total of ten) shapes in French. The next lesson will focus on the remaining five.
- L2** - Five more nouns for shapes in French
- L3** - Consolidate of all ten shapes in French, with a focus on the article
- L4** - Further re-enforcement of the ten shapes using the numbers 1-5.
- L5** - The children will consolidate numbers and shapes using a variety of creative activities.
- L6** - To revise all language covered in this unit and complete assessment materials.

CONTEXT:

Chn will be looking at furthering conversation/reading/writing skills. This will include more conjugation work, as well as using their understanding GPS to construct and manipulate French sentences as well as examining singular and plurals.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE:

- I can repeat and recognise a few of the 10 shapes in French.
- I can/can attempt to possibly spell one of these words unaided from memory, possibly more if I have the support of a gap fill activity and/or word bank.
- I can give the correct article for the shape if I hear it first.
- I can count from 1-5 in French if somebody says these numbers it to me first.

SKILLS:

Working on being able to pronounce and remember new words in French using clear colourful images of the shapes to help us. Learning our first words in French and learning to remember the article/determiner alongside the noun. Using what we know in English to help us. Working on remembering the shapes in French over a longer period of time.
